AQ - CAT (Al Qadir Common Aptitude test)

- Quantitative Reasoning 60 Minutes (40MCQs)
- Verbal Reasoning 60 Minutes (40MCQs)

Validity of Test: One year

Quantitative Reasoning Section:

Quantitative Reasoning Section: The quantitative section of the AQ- CAT is designed to measure candidates ability to reason mathematically, use algebra, interpret graphic data, and analyze and use information in the context of word problems.

The section will consist of multiple choice questions that test student's ability to solve questions involving algebra, geometry, data interpretation and problem solving among others.

The test will consist of 40 questions within a time limit of 60 minutes. Calculators are not allowed in the quantitative section.

Verbal Reasoning Section:

The verbal reasoning section is designed to measure candidate's ability to read and comprehend written material.

Candidates will be required to read and correct grammatical and structural errors in passages as part of an assessment of their writing abilities.

The test will also assess the analytical abilities with analogy questions

Candidates will also be required to read, understand and respond to questions based on short and/or long passages. The Verbal Reasoning section will include passages from several areas but will not test any prior understanding of content contained within the passage.

Candidates will also be assessed on their ability to complete sentences using choices provided.

This section will consist of 40 multiple choice questions to be answered within a time limit of 60 minutes.
